## EDDA WINS IN RECORD TIME

Lands the Mile Feature on the Closing Day in 1:38 3-5—  
Favorites and Second Choices in Front.

RACE TRACK, WINDSOR, July 20.—J. W. Schorr's Edda won the D. and C. Stake, the carded feature of the afternoon and, incidentally, established a new track record for the mile, clipping two-fifths of a second off the old mark of 1:38 3-5. Helen Barbee went to the front, opened up a big lead, followed by Spellbound. Edda was out-run to the stretch turn, where she came with a terrific burst of speed and won going away. Helen Barbee easily outlasted Spellbound for the place. In the opening event Lewis just lasted long enough to get the decision from Toy Boy by a nose, with the favorite winning. 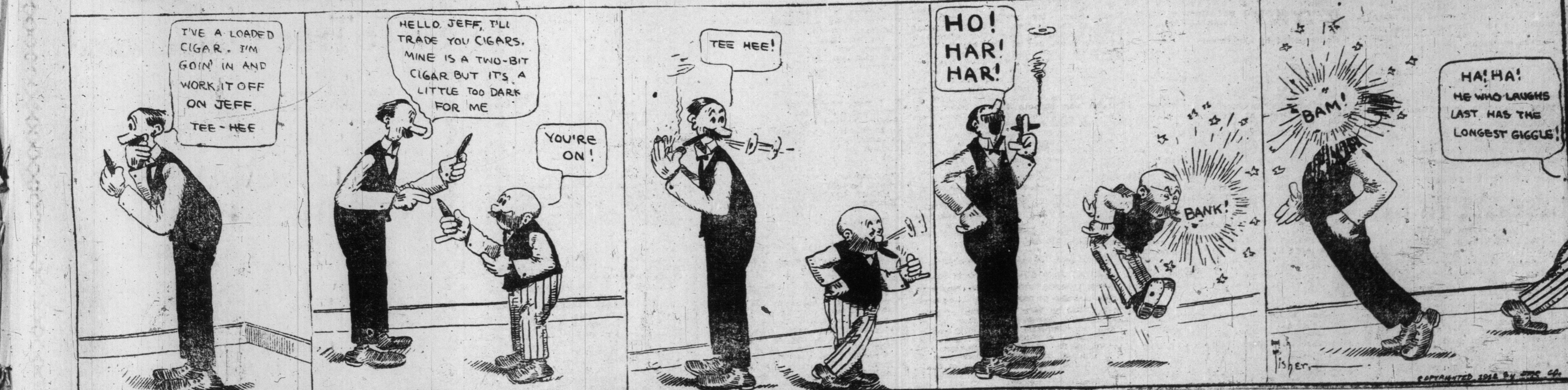
