SAMPLES OF SEED GRAIN. A Good Chance to Raise Your Own Pure Seed Grains From a Plot.

The director of the government ex-perimental farms has sent out the fol-lowing circular; by this it is possible to get a sample of pure seeds from which get a sample of pure seeds from which each farmer may grow his own seeds by making a return of the results of the experiment to the government:

By instruction of the hon, minister of agriculture a distribution will be made this season of samples of superior sorts of grain to Canadian farmers for the improvement of seed. The stock for distribution is of the very best and has been secured mainly from the exhas been secured mainly from the ex-cellent crops recently had at the branch experimental farms at Indian Head, Sask., and at Brandon, Man. The distribution will consist of samples of oats, spring wheat, bariey, Indian corn (for ensilage only) and potatoes. The quantity of oats to be sent will be 4 lbs., and of wheat or barley 5 lbs., sufficient in each case to sow one-twenty that the corn of the samples of Indian tieth of an acre. The samples of Indian corn and potatoes will weigh 3 lbs. each, A quantity of each of the following varieties has been secured for this dis-

Oats—Banner, Wide-Awake, White Giant, Danish Island, Thousand Dollar, Improved Ligowo (white varieties) and Goldfinder (yellow).

Wheat—Red Fife, Preston, Pringle's UNLISTED SECURITIES. LIMITED. Champlain, Percy, Stanley, Huron and White Fife.

Barley—Six-rowed—Mensury, Odessa, Mansfield and Claude. Two-rowed— Standwell, Invincible, Canadian Thorpe

Standwell, Invincible, Canadian Thorpe and Sidney.
Indian corn (for ensilage)—Early sorts, Angel of Midnight, Compton's Early and Longfellow; later varieties, Selected Leaming, Early Mastodon and White Cap Yellow Dent.

Farmers are advised to apply early to avoid possible disappointment. Those applying for Indian corn or potatoes will please bear in mind that the corn is not usually distributed until March, and that potatoes cannot be mailed from here until danger from frost in transit is over. Nc postage is required on mail matter addressed to the Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa.

# TACKLES AN ENTIRE TRAIN

Loots Passengers in Two Coaches and Begins on Third When Conductor Trims Him.

Kansas City, Mo., Nov. 26.-A daring train robbery was committed 100 miles st of Kansas City early to-day. Be en Slater and Armstrong, Mo., a stance of 21 miles, a masked man, single-handed, robbed 20 passengers in three cars of the fast east-bound combination Chicago and Alton-Chicago, Burlington and Quincy passenger train. After half an hour's work he secured approximately two thousand dollars, besides several watches and other pleces of jewelry. The man finally was overpowered by Conductor Heywood, who knocked a revolver from the robber's hand and forced him to the car floor. The robber was bound, made to disgorge and four hours after the robbery was committed was placed in jail. The robber, who said his name was Trueheart and that he came from Chifornia, was recognized by the engineer as the same man who on Nov. 9 last, in an exactly similar manner and at the same place on the road, went thru the rear sleeper of an east-bound Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Overland Limited, which on this division runs ngle-handed, robbed 20 passengers in Limited, which on this division runs over the Alton tracks.

It was a 25-minute run from Slater to Glasgow and he awaited the arrival at the latter place. As the train stopped at Glasgow he swung off and boarded the chair car as it rushed by a moment later. Conductor Heywood appeared upon the scene here and Trueheart, with the command "Throw up your hands," pointed his weapon at the conductor's breast. Instead of complying, the conductor knocked up the weapon, threw himself upon the man and bore him to the car floor.

Conductor Heywood says that the robber snapped his revolver at him and that probably the only thing that saved his life was that the hammer descended on his thumb.
