DYNAMITE ENOUGH TO BLOW UP HALF HAMILTON

Arrests Made of Men Who Had in Their Possession Forty Sticks—General News.

HAMILTON, Sept. 22.—(Special).—There was enough dynamite in the cells at No. 3 Police Station to-night to blow up half the city. It was found in the possession of John Dale, Cathcart and Kelly-streets, a teamster, 43 years of age, and Fred Taylor, 122 1-2 King William-street, a laborer. They were both locked up at noon to-day, and the charge against them is having explosives in their possession, the maximum penalty for which is 14 years. Other charges may also be laid.

It is thought that the dynamite belongs to the contractor on the Brantford & Hamilton Railway. The story the police tell is that the prisoners were seen, with the staff on the mountain by some youths. When the youths remonstrated with the pair, it is charged that one of them threatened to throw a stick of dynamite and blow the whole gang up. The youths telephoned for the police and kept the pair surrounded. Constable Brannon made the arrests without much trouble.

The dynamite was in a bag and there were 40 sticks of it fitted up with nitroglycerine cartridges. The cartridges were removed before the dynamite was taken to the cells.
