Large Decreases in the Available Supplies.

LIVERPOOL IS 1-4D HIGHER

Business on the Canadian Stock Exchange Dull Yesterday.

Mr. Wells advocates spring shooting, and quotes Mr. William Leane, a shooter of fifty years' experience, who remembers the glorious days when plover and all sorts of game were plentiful, but what is the condition now? He says that he has never seen a plover since he was a boy, and that the little spotted snapper, or dip, with which everyone is so fond of shooting, is now very scarce.

Then he speaks of the "Knot" (Tringa Canadensis), an exceedingly rare bird, now almost extinct by ruthless shooting. Another is the curlew, he does not say which of the three varieties we have here, but it matters not, for all are scarce.

Now, all the birds mentioned by these gentlemen, the golden plover and yellowlegs are the only ones worth mentioning, the others are mostly rarities, and would they want the Government to change the season to allow them to shoot? He says that he has never seen a plover since he was a boy, and that the little spotted snapper, or dip, with which everyone is so fond of shooting, is now very scarce.
