

DIED IN PENITENTIARY. George Young, Who Shot and Killed Fred Glover in Elgin County,

Has Passed Away. St. Thomas, Feb. 18.-Chief of Police

Fewings yesterday received a telegram announcing the death in Kingston Peniten-tiary of George Young, sentenced to im-prisonment for life, for the murder of Fred Glover, near Southwold Station. Giover, with others, was hauling ice from a pond at Young's place, when Glover's dog attacked one of Young's turkeys. A quar-rel ensued, and Young went into the house, got his revolver, loaded it and shot Glover in the back as he was walking down the road driving his team. At the first trial of Young there was a disagreement of the jury, but at the next trial Young pleaded guilty and was sentenced to imprisonment for life. Some weeks ago, owing to Young's health and it being evident that he could not live long, Hon. D. Mills, Minister of Justice, acceded to a pelition asking for his release, but he died before being re-leased. bouncing the death in Kingston Peniten-


