

PLANNED BY EMMA GOLDMAN SEARCHING IN THE SEWERS

That is the Opinion Now Shared By a Good Many People in the City of Buffalo.

THE WOMAN WAS THERE AUG. 31. SECRET SERVICE MEN ON A HUNT.

That Was the Day the Assassins Said He Arrived There—Plot Hatched in Buffalo.

Buffalo, Sept. 11.—The Evening Times says: Why did Emma Goldman, once a sewing woman in Rochester, make such extensive trips about the country, on mere pleasure trips. Her own statement indicates that she has been in Buffalo twice since July 12. That date was about the time that President's day at the Pan-American Exposition was fixed for Sept. 6. She says that, since July 12, she saw Czoizols, and it was with him and Marie Isak. Local information points to the position that Goldman was in Buffalo on the Saturday before the President was shot. That was the day on which Czoizols says he arrived in Buffalo.

Is it reasonable to believe that Goldman planned the thing; that she saw Reda in St. Louis, and did not find the man to do the deed; that she turned to the Isaks, the one of whom is the editor of the organ of the Free Society, to find out who could be secured to commit the crime; that they produced Czoizols; that, with Miss Isak, she came to Buffalo to look over the hotel and the location of the buildings at the Exposition; that she saw Czoizols here at the time of his arrival?

That is the theory the authorities are working on. They believe that the Goldman trip was a saleswoman's trip, blind to cover up her plans to do away with the President.

Complicity Hatched. That the conspiracy to kill the President was hatched in Buffalo can be read between the lines of statements credited to Emma Goldman after her arrest in Chicago yesterday. Those same statements indicate that the incitator came from out of town. Here are excerpts from her talk in Chicago just after her arrest:

"I met the man they say shot the President in Chicago on July 12. I wouldn't know him if I should see him again. I did not learn his name, but I do remember afterward seeing his name published in Free Society, with the warning that he was a spy. I was leaving for Rochester that day. Miss Isak was going with me and the Chicagoer, Miss Isak, said she was going to Buffalo to see the Pan-American Exposition and to make the trip through Buffalo. Just as we were starting from the house with the party which went to see us off, the doorbell rang. Someone went to the door and the Chicagoer, Mr. Isak, Mr. Isak was not there. It was dark, and we did not pay much attention to the man. One does not pay heed to such things when parting from friends. I always stay at the Isak home, and we are warm friends.

Emma Goldman says by account of her movements: "Left Chicago with Marie Isak, 8:30 p.m., July 12, arrived at Buffalo with Miss Isak, July 13; left Buffalo for Rochester, July 15; stayed in Rochester a little more than two weeks, not having seen the Buffalo Exposition up to that time; between Aug. 15 and 16, went to Buffalo, and on Tuesday, Aug. 19, started for Pittsburgh to become travelling saleswoman for a New York house. Left Pittsburgh for St. Louis, still as saleswoman, arrived in St. Louis Sept. 2, Labor Day, where remained until Sept. 10 for Chicago.

Goldman History. As to her general history, Goldman has the following: "I was born in St. Petersburg, Russia, 25 years ago; I came to this country with my sister, who is now in Rochester, 15 years ago. I speak Russian, German, French and English. I came from the middle class in Russia, but my heart has been in the poor and down-trodden. The injustice of the Haymarket prosecution made an anarchist of me. I have taught the creed of Anarchy ever since."

Emma Goldman is not physically attractive. A little, broad, short woman, with a somewhat of a hump, she appears to much better advantage seated, when only her features are noted, than when she is standing or walking around. Her forehead and hair are two prominent features which attract the eye. She has a very rarely seen, very fine, light brown hair, with little curls, slightly over the temples, set off. Her jaw is broad and heavy, giving her expression at all times great strength. Her nose, not prominent, is curiously rounded at the end. Her eyes may not have glinted at all her best today, and there was always a tired look in them, which made one think that, the woman was still a young woman, barely 25, the force of passion were already beginning to show their consuming effects. She speaks briefly, with quiet understanding and ready answer, whether a personal remark or a pointed argument is to be given, but she has a slight German accent, not always noticeable, but sometimes becoming very marked.

Didn't Read Papers. A press despatch says: Although the whole world was watching her, she did not read a newspaper, and she did not read a paper. She was on Saturday night before her interest was sufficiently aroused to buy a newspaper containing the arrest of the Chicago anarchists than in the President's condition. Here are some of Goldman's credited statements:

"McKintley is simply a tool in the hands of the wealthy. He is the most ineffectual President the United States has had. I do not see what could come out of killing him. I know that there are people in desperate circumstances who may be driven to commit desperate acts."

Twenty cents only is the charge, with the usual small amount of luncheon prices, thirty-five cents would not be deemed exorbitant.
