STEAMER BURNED, CREW SAVED. Cargo Boat Stevens Total Loss_Men

Get Ashore.

Get Ashore. Port Rowan, Sept. 9,—Yesterday af-ternoon about 3.30 the steamer Wil-Nam H. Stevens, bound from Duluth to Buffalo, caugh fire on Lake Erie, op-posite Clear Creek, and is a total loss. Her cargo consisted of 32,000 bushels of flax, 185 tons of copper and 9000 barrels of flour. At the time of the fire there was a heavy sea running, and the crew experienced some diffi-culty in landing. The mate, R. H. Knapp, was the first to make the at-tempt with eleven of the crew. It now being dark, 1.30 a.m., this was a very dangerous undertaking, as the shore is very bad, 15 to 20 feet high in places. After finding a spot to land safely the mate built fires on the beach to guide the others, who succeeded in effecting a landing about daylight. The captain remained aboard until the last. The crew are now all safe, twenty-one in number, and are at Port Rowan.




