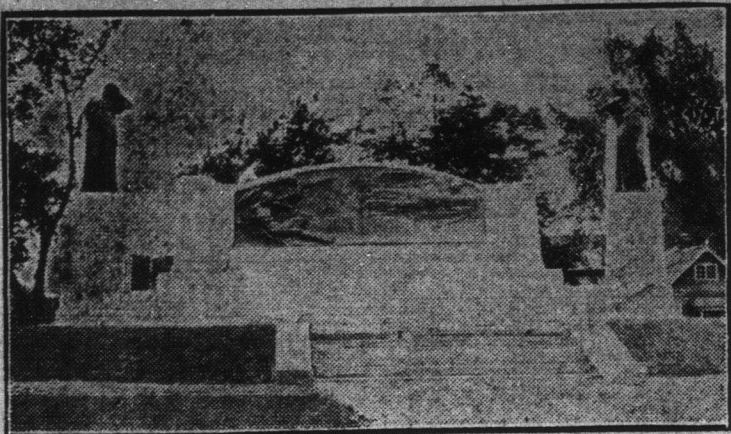

## BELL MEMORIAL MONUMENT



The handsome memorial has been erected to commemorate the invention of the telephone by Alexander Graham Bell in Brantford in 1874. The unveiling is to take place on October 24, and the inventor, Dr. Alexander Graham Bell and Mrs. Bell, the Duke of Devonshire and many other eminent people will be present to take part in the dedication ceremonies. The monument was designed by the Canadian sculptor, Walter S. Allward. The dominant notes represented in the monument are: First, two heroic figures in bronze at either side representing "Humanity," sending and receiving messages; second, man discovering his power to transmit vocal sounds through space. This is shown in the large bronze panel, representing "Man," surmounted by a figure symbolic of "Intelligence," and three floating figures representing three messengers, "Knowledge, Joy, Sorrow."

## HUNGARIAN ARTIST DANGEROUS IN BRITAIN

No Legal Evidence Against Him, But Interned.

LONDON, Oct. 18.—Explaining in the House of Commons today the denial by the advisory committee of the home office yesterday of the appeal against the detention of Philip Alexius Laszlo de Hombois, Hungarian artist, Sir George Cave, the home secretary, said there were grave reasons to suspect him of being engaged in activities which might prove dangerous to the public interest. Sir George added that there was no legal evidence on which he could be convicted of a criminal offence.

## PRESS OF GERMANY TRYING TO BEITTE LANSING EXPOSURE OF BENSTORFF PLOT

Charge U. S. Secretary With Forgery in a Teletype Cablegram.

Amsterdam, Oct. 19.—Count von Bernstorff, former German ambassador to the United States, did not know Bolo Pasha, the Frenchman held as a spy in France, according to the Tagblatt. Discussing the Bolo affair, the newspaper says:

"In connection with the Bolo Pasha episode and the disclosures of Secretary Lansing concerning the part alleged to have been played by Ambassador von Bernstorff and Foreign Secretary von Jagow, we are informed by a competent source that the personality of Bolo Pasha was not known to von Bernstorff in Washington, inasmuch as the ambassador did not have access to sources in the United States which might have been at the disposal of official quarters here. It is also established that the name of Bolo Pasha was never made known to von Bernstorff, and his banker intermediaries did not mention him. Consequently the passage in the alleged telegram published by Secretary of State Lansing, in which von Jagow asked von Bernstorff, 'What is new about Bolo?' is a forgery."

The Tagblatt further says that the mention of Bolo's name in the von Jagow dispatch is "another forgery of the German press."

## New Chains of Lakes Discovered in Labrador

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld., Oct. 18.—Chains of lakes hitherto unmapped, and rivers equally unknown, were traversed in the interior of Labrador by the exploring parties of the National Geographic Society and the Carnegie Museum, Pittsburgh, which arrived here yesterday.

The journey covered about 750 miles over a route never before traversed by white man, and was made more difficult by the fact that the five Indians who were taken along as guides proved to be unfamiliar with the country. The party included: W. E. C. Todd, curator of ornithology in the Carnegie Museum; O. J. Murie, curator of mammals in the same institution, and Alfred Marshall of Chicago.

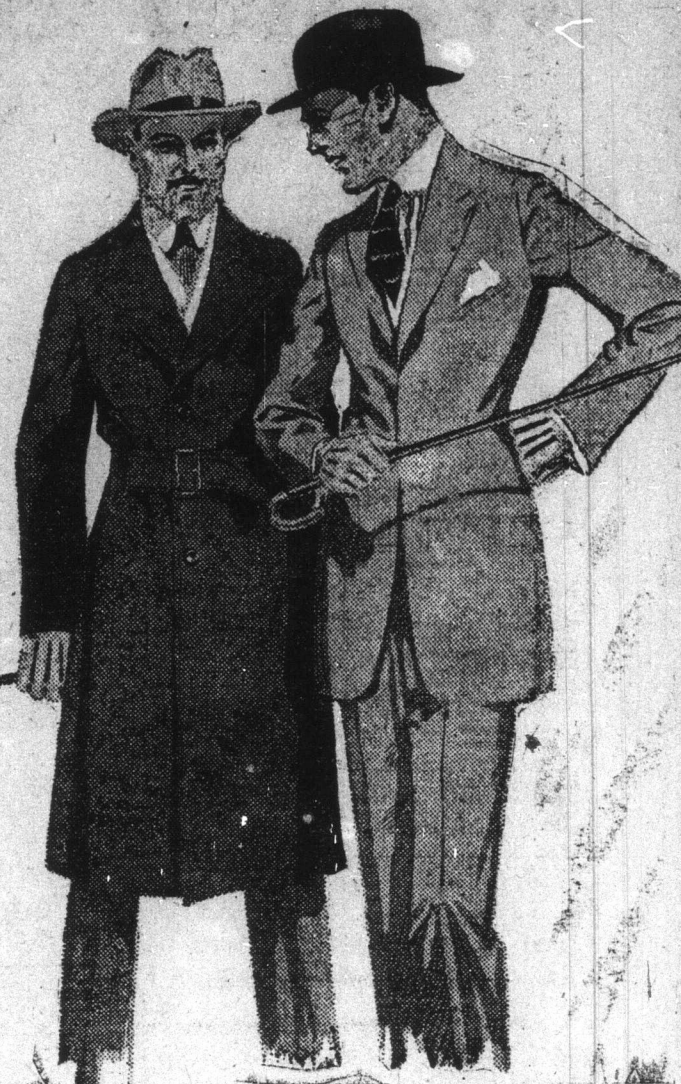

Among the telegrams given out by Secretary of State Lansing on October 5 was the following: "No. 208, May 31.—The person announced on telegram 692 of March 20, has not yet reported himself at the legation at Bern. Is there any more news on your side of Bolo?"

"JAGOW." In the inquiry into the Bolo affair in New York early this month, it was learned that Bolo had an accomplice in Switzerland, and that he had learned the terms on which Germany would conclude peace with France. Bolo Pasha is said to have received more than \$1,000,000 from von Bernstorff to aid in carrying out his plot.

## GEN. GURKO ESCAPED ON ENGLISH VESSEL; REACHES ENGLAND

Russ General, Friend of Deposed Czar, Exiles Himself.

London, Oct. 19.—Gen. Gurko, former commander on the Russian southwestern front, has arrived in England with his family on board a British ship. The correspondent of the Daily Express, who interviewed him, says that the ship was lying at the entrance to the river outside the port of Archangel awaiting orders to depart for England, when late at night a tug stole alongside and two unidentified passengers walked up the companion ladder. They registered under assumed names, and Gurko, who had been established by a few of the other passengers.

"How Gen. Gurko evaded his enemies at Petrograd," the correspondent says, "and reached Archangel; how he found friends and remained in retirement in Archangel must remain a secret."

Gen. Gurko told newspapermen last night that he was given permission to leave Russia as soon as possible after his release from imprisonment in the fortress of St. Peter and St. Paul. "I was imprisoned," the general said, "because letters which I had written to the former emperor were cited as evidence of my ill feeling toward the republic. After several months of confinement nothing was found to justify a trial and I was released. My intention is to remain in England until matters in Russia become more settled."

## 75,000 HOMELESS BY SALONIKI'S GREAT FIRE

Washington, Oct. 19.—According to an official dispatch from Washington today from Athens, about 75,000 persons were rendered homeless and destitute by the recent fire in Saloniki of whom some 60,000 are Jews. More than 10,000 of the victims are camping in the environs.

## LAKE ONTARIO WHIPPED BY ANOTHER BIG BLOW

Kingston, Oct. 19.—Not in many years have mariners out of Kingston experienced such continued rough weather on river and lakes. Another big blow set in last night and the harbor is filled with vessels. The wind is blowing a terrible gale, which is accompanied by a heavy rain. The Canadian Lake Lines went around near Brockville on her way, light to Kingston.

GATHERING IN SUSPECTS. New York, Oct. 18.—Federal authorities arrested 53 German mechanics at the Fulton Langtry drydocks at Hoboken today. Several other suspects were gathered in during the day in Manhattan, and all the prisoners were sent to Ellis Island.
