Moncton, N. B., May 2.—(Special)—An innovation in church work will be introduced in Wesley Memorial church next Sunday when "Mothers' Day" will be observed. The idea is to pay a tribute to mothers, and all who attend service will be asked to wear a "white carnation" in honor of their mothers. This will be the first time such a service has been held here and effort is being made to get other churches to observe a mothers' day, which will be an annual event in future on the second Sunday in May. REV. MR. ANTHONY
ELOQUENT BEFORE
EVERY DAY CLUB

That there is no such thing as salvation by growth, either for a nation, a community or an individual, was the theme discussed by Rev. S. W. Anthony in a brief but eloquent address at the Every Day Club last evening. We say that the child who exhibits passion and strikes his brother will outgrow it, but let the passion grow and the muscles develop and the blow becomes the blow of Cain, that killed his brother Abel. A grain of wheat will grow to many grains of wheat, but thistle seed will not grow to be a field of wheat. There must be the right kind of growth. The produce the right kind of growth. They must be destroyed. The United States did not outgrow slavery, but was forced to crush it out in the end at enormous cost of blood and treasure. The speaker referred to the Mormon propaganda, as one that still threatened his continent. He referred also to the campaign against tuberculosis, and to the nourishment of flowers bloom. If we grow up, we must be nourished by the greatest evil of all, is the liquor traffic. Mr. Anthony referred to the option contract and severely condemned this Christian people who failed to throw themselves into that fight. In a reference to Rev. A. B.
