

HOCKEY LEAGUE TO MEET IN MONTREAL

Controversy Over Status of Western Players Likely to be Settled Amicably

NEW YORK, Sept. 23.—Nothing definite concerning the plans for the coming season was done at today's meeting of the National Hockey League held here. Representatives of the ten clubs of the league were present and the gathering merely was a preliminary to the annual meeting which will be held in Montreal on Saturday.

Today's discussion chiefly concerned the relationship of the N. H. L. to the now-defunct Western League. Certain of the N. H. L. clubs are in doubt as to the exact status of players of the western circuit. Whether they are free agents or whether they are still covered by the Patrick interests in the Pacific Coast is evidently causing contract trouble. However, it was intimated by President Calder that all would be straightened out in time to allow a smooth running annual meeting on Saturday.

The delegates at today's meeting will be guests of Tex Rickard and Col. J. S. Hammond of the New York Rangers at the Dempsey-Tunney heavyweight battle in Philadelphia tomorrow night.

CITY HALL AND THE CIVIC INVESTIGATION.
Sir,—It is stated in Tuesday's Globe that following Mr. Olive's example, Commissioner Wigmore recommends Dr. Brittain as investigator, not only of the city but of the county as well. Moreover he seems to listen to suggestions from any citizen or body of citizens, but the final decision in all matters must rest with the Common Council, who had the mandate of the people.
It is, therefore, the Mayor, but the Commissioners who are to decide whether the request of the 8,000 taxpayers be granted or refused.
The petition asked for "a thorough audit and investigation of the city books and accounts, covering all departments, including the assessors, by an auditor appointed by the Council, but named or approved by the petitioners; second, that efficiency experts be appointed in the same manner as the auditor, that the auditor and efficiency experts make reports from time to time to the press and to the petitioners' committee on request."
It now narrows down to the Commissioners, and each one of these gentlemen is invited to tell the 8,000 taxpayers, through the medium of the press, just where he stands.
