## MANITOBA NOT DECIDED YET ABOUT ITS HYDRO

Legislature Receives Signatures of 79,195 People for Change in Liquor Law.

Winnipeg, Jan. 23.—That the government has not yet decided on any policy in regard to the provincial hydro system was a statement made by Hon. W. R. Clubb, minister of public works, in the legislature last night. Joseph Bernier of St. Boniface had quoted newspaper reports that the government was negotiating with the Manitoba Power Company for the sale of the property. Containing 79,195 signatures, the petition of the moderation League of M. a. a. for legislation for the sale of alcohol liquor, under government control, for beverage purposes, was presented. Mayor S. J. Farmer moved a resolution urging the Dominion Government to assume a portion of the cost of providing unemployment relief on a similar basis to that of last winter. It was not put to the house, however, Hon. W. R. Craig, attorney-general, adjourning the debate.

## OPPOSITION MANIFEST IN QUEBEC CONTEST

Montreal, Jan. 23.—Arthur Sauve, leader of the Quebec Conservative opposition, yesterday issued the manifesto of his party. It demands that the service of justice be made less expensive; a policy to respond more readily to the needs of agriculture, of the farmer and the workman; the grants voted for agriculture to be spent with a view to lightening the burden of obligations on the farmer; protection of the rural schools; a policy to encourage the placing of Canadian capital and the development of our natural resources for the benefit of our population; a national inventory, or stock-taking; justice for the lumber merchants, for whom the industry is
