Washington, Oct. 9—Through efforts of American relief organizations the transport Scharnhorst is en route from Vladivostok to Trieste, the Red Cross announced today, with 2,200 Hungarians, Galicians and Ukranians, captured by the Russian armies during the war. The men who have been confined in the Siberian prison camps for more than two years, will be repatriated.

The Scharnhorst is one of several ships chartered by relief associations co-operating with Dr. Fridtjof Nansen, the polar explorer, director of the repatriation
