New York, Aug. 28—(Wall street)—
The conciliatory attitude of the labor organizations in connection with existing differences in the steel industry imparted almost a buoyant tone to stocks at the active opening of today's session. United States Steel made a maximum gain of 11-4 points on a sale of 1,100 shares and other steels rose one to three points with equipment, motors, oils and shippings.
