## RAISED \$200,000 AT

Montreal, Feb. 15—Montreal Methodists, who announced the other day a campaign to obtain \$250,000 to erect a new building for the Wesleyan Theologoical College, last night raised \$200,610 of the amount at a dinner given at the Montreal Club.

The company that sat to dinner was representative of Montreal Methodism, and there were as guests of the evening the Rev. Dr. Carman, the venerable General Superintendent of the Church, and the Rev. Dr. Graham, Educational Secretary. G. F. Johnston, chairman of the Board of Governors of the College, presided at the head table. After Rev. Principal Smythe had described the difficulties under which the work of the college is being carried on in a building overcrowded and lacking in modern appointments, Rev. Dr. Carman in a spirited address rallied his hearers to the cause of education as identified with the Wesleyan College, by an nouncing his intention of going on the subscription list, as he had already done for a similar cause in Vancouver in the far west; and in Saskville in the near east. Chairman Johnston was enabled to announce a subscription of \$200,610, of which one subscription was for \$50,000 from J. W. McConnell, conditional on the raising a total fund of \$300,000 for the building and endowment of the college.

## GREAT RAILROAD STRIKE IS

TEMPORARILY AVERTED

New York, Feb. 15—A new possibility of peace between the fifty-four eastern railroads and their 34,000 firemen who have threatened to strike for higher wages and revised working conditions, appeared last night with a fresh arbitration proposal by the railroads, and the strike that seemed imminent during the day was averted, temporarily at least.
