righteousness; that the Man of God may be perfect, and thoroughly furnished unto all good works, and although it cannot be reconciled to man's wildom, it is agreeable notwithstanding to the christians experience : for instance the electing, everlasting love of God ; you look back to the rock from whence you were hewn; and the hole of the pit, from whence you were digged ; and you fee that your falvation originated in the divine purpose; and that he who chose you out of the world, gave you eternal life : fo as they are chofen out of the world ; it is in fulfilment of God's gracious defign that any finner is led to embrace the Saviour ; for he has faid that " no man can come unto me, except the He does not fay Father who hath fent me draw him." no man can merit the favour of God, no man can change his own heart ; but, no man can come unto me ; these texts would not ftand in agreement with man's power and free will, which would be to fuppofe life in the foul already, and confequently they could live without him : and we must particularly notice, that previous to the quickening power of the Holy Spirit, man is dead in trefpaffes and fins : and nothing could render the work of the fpirit neceffary, but the want of native purity, and the greatnets of our depravity. It would be triffing to dwell fo long on this fubject, if it was not rendered neceffary by the strained, unferintural, and incautious phrafeology, adopted by those who advocate the notion of Free Will : you then fee the neceffity of being established in the doctrine of Grace ; that man's pride may be humbled, and God glorified as all and in all.

2d. We recommend perfonal holine's, as a neceffary confequence of free grace : and as requifite to the peace, and profperity of the Church : the first of thefe propositions is abundantly proved. "They are called with an holy calling : the Grace of God teacheth us to deny ungodline's, and worldly lusts ; and to live Soberly, Righteoufly, and Godly, in this prefent evil world. The Saviour's work of redemption ; and the Spirits work in bringing home the purchafed fheep : and their obedience to the Shepherd's voice, are all connected ; and centre in the everlasting love of God," they fhall be called the Holy people, the redeemed of the Lord, and thou fhalt be called fought out ; a city not forfaken, ISA 62. 12. Be careful then to covet things that are honest, lovely, and of good report; in particular
