## The Labor Situation at Corner Brook

The labor situation at Corner Brook this year is not very bright and promising. It was expected early in the season that the unemployment situation would be met largely by work at this big industrial centre, but by messages received recently by Mr. C. E. Russell, Minister of Public Works, in response to enquiries he directed to the Company's labor agent and the management there, no encouragement for immediate employment was given.

On May 27th Major Butler wired saying:—"Prospects very poor for employment here, and I see no improvement likely for this season."

Mr. Russell was also informed that most of the house building during the coming year would be done by contract, and as far as known the contractors have all the men they require. The Company's own organization for house construction is fully staffed, and at present no carpenters or laborers are required.

A heavy thunder and lightning storm raged over this town and vicinity for several hours this (Friday) evening. We learn that a thunder bolt fell in the water, opposite Mr. Jesse Gosse's store at Spaniard's Bay, and that Mr. P. Murphy received injuries while engaged in electrical work. Up to press hour we have heard of no further damage being done.
