PROSPECTS FOR APPLE CROP UNFAVORABLE

Report from Dep't of Agriculture Says, in All Districts Outlook Changed for Worst Last Month.

Ottawa, July 19.—Since the June report of the fruit division of the Department of Agriculture, the weather in eastern Canada has been very irregular. For some fruits, and in some places, the conditions have been ideal, but in the main it has been too dry, and cold. The effect of this has been to materially shorten the small fruit crop in Ontario, and to lower the prospects for all kinds of fruit in the Maritime Provinces.

Peas share with apples the depreciation in prospects. The plum crop will be a fairly good one, not large, but of excellent quality, unless unfavorable weather intervenes in the Niagara district, peaches have escaped the frosts well, and a fair crop, almost a large one is expected. The grape crop of Western Ontario is about up to the average.

The recent rains have materially improved the prospects for the raspberry crop, and if favorable weather continues, a good crop will be harvested in sections. The strawberry crop has been excellent. The weather has been favorable for tomatoes. Nevertheless, the growth is fair, and the acreage much larger than last year. It is not expected that the yield per plant will be nearly so large as last year.

DIES WHILE VISITING OLD HOMESTEAD

Dr. Geo. Butler Passes Away at Yarmouth Shortly after Arriving for First Visit in 37 Years.

Halifax, July 20.—A death attended with sad circumstances occurred at Yarmouth Saturday in the passing away of Dr. George K. Butler, of London, England, at the home of his sister, Mrs. Annie B. Rogers.
The deceased was a son of the late Nathan Butler, of Yarmouth, and had been absent from here over 37 years, having arrived on Thursday morning, July 18, at Yarmouth, on his way to visit his sister and other relatives. He was on deck early that morning in order to catch a first class steamer for the harbor, and in this way contracted a heavy cold, which later developed into pneumonia, which, together with a weak heart, hastened the end.

The deceased, who was about 61 years of age, received his medical training at McGill University, and at St. Thomas hospital, London, where he has since successfully practiced his profession. He leaves a widow, five children, and one son, who accompanied him.
