Judge Robson Won't Allow Sale of Calgary Stocks Unless Proved They Are for Bona

Winnipeg, May 20.—There will be no Calgary oil stocks of the wild cat or speculative kind sold in Manitoba. Judge Robson, public utilities commissioner, has refused stock brokers who rushed down from Calgary permission to sell stocks in this province. His sole aid is to protect the public. No Calgary oil stock of any kind will be sold in Manitoba until the corporations who wish to place it on the market satisfy Judge Robson that the stock is for a bona fide well. In addition they must submit a finanancial statement showing that the proposition is on a sound basis.



# WITH THE FALL OF TAMPICO TO REBELS MEXICO CITY LOSES ITS SUPPLY OF FUEL DIL





The constitutionalists, under General Pablo Gonzales and General Luis Caballeros, with 7,000 men, captured Tampico and entered the city as the federals abandoned it. The supply of fuel oil, which comes from the Tampico district, now is cut off, and Mexico City is without means of obtaining fuel for railway locomotives or the industrial companies which operate their plants by means of fuel oil. The capture of Tampico by the rebels means that the petroleum fields of Mexico are now in their possession, except for unimportant wells in the State of Vera Cruz and the isthmian fields and refinery operated by Lord Cowdray.
