steamer or vessel shall be permitted
to land at any port in the Dominion
of Newfoundland, any person who has
been resident in the Provinces of
Nova Scotia or New Brunswick, who
cannot give satisfactory evidence of
successful vaccination within the past
seven years, said vaccination being at
the time of taking passage, at least
fourteen days old.

Persons who intend travelling to
Newfoundland will take notice that
conformity with the above regulations
is necessary.
