New York, April 23. Gold 117 1/4; slight exchange 109 3/8. A decision adverse to Stokes was rendered in court to-day, and it is now believed that he will be hanged for the murder of Plak.

The bridge over the Maine Central Railroad, at Kendall's Mills, Maine, was burned to-day. The loss is estimated at \$100,000.

LONDON, April 23. As intimated yesterday, the managers of the Atlantic cable have determined to increase the tariffs to six shillings (\$1.50 gold) per word. The advanced rates will go into effect on the 1st of May. The reason assigned is the limited facilities for transmission, caused by the interruption of the French cable.

The weather to-day is fair and favorable to crops. The Carovitz of Russia, and wife will visit London during the month of July. Consols 93 1/2. Markets generally quiet.

THE INDIAN WAR. New York, April 23. A despatch from the lava beds says that the Modocs were seen in their camp yesterday, Tuesday morning, and the Warm Springs Indians are to be put on their track at once. Our camp was not attacked on Monday night as was anticipated. A light fall of snow showered water to the Modocs hidden in the rocks. More teams were reported fired on Monday evening and a Modoc ambush was discovered. The troops have been stationed to fire upon any Modoc going to the lake for water, all the wounded are doing well, and the prospects for laying the whole tribe are brightening.

A letter from the Hickok says the recent volcanic eruption in Iceland continued without cessation for five days and nights, affording a most splendid spectacle, and doing but little damage. For nine hours a pillar of flames apparently a mile in circumference, shot towards the heavens.

One Allen of Chicago, is collecting documents and employing lawyers to prosecute a suit for the ownership of the four square miles on which Mt. Morris, Livingston County, stands, claiming that it was ceded to an ancestor, Ebenzer Allen, by the Seneca Indians about 1790 and has never passed out of the rightful ownership of the family.

A majority of the Massachusetts legislative committee on railroads have reported a bill for consolidating the Boston & Lowell, Fitchburg, Vermont & Massachusetts, Troy & Greenfield and Boston & Boston roads, including the tunnel. The Consolidated roads to be known as the Troy & Greenfield Railroad and Hoosac Tunnel with power to make a perpetual lease of the other roads forming the line between Boston and Troy.

It is rumored that the Earl of Delaware has committed suicide. The extensive bleach factory of Peak & Frier, London, was burned yesterday.

The case of the claimant of the Trehorne estate for alleged piracy came on for trial yesterday. Sir Samuel Baker is reported dead at Palokoa, Africa.

The permanent committee of the National Assembly held a session to-day. The Ministers were present and hopes are more entertained that an agreement will be reached between these five branches of the Government.

An insane mother murdered her two children in New York, on Wednesday evening. Four men were murdered and robbed by Indians in Kansas on the 11th inst.

The great railroad bridge at Kendall's Mills, Me., was burned Wednesday—loss \$50,000.

The New York Supreme Court having decided adversely to Stokes his friends despair of saving him.
