CST. GIESBRECHT HONORED On August 15. 1985, the people of Vegreville gathered at the Elks Park to dedicate a plaque to the memory of Cst. Allen Giesbrecht. On January 13, 1985, Cst. Giesbrecht was slain while on duty and responding to a complaint in the Town of Vegreville. A citizens' group which was spearheaded by a ball team that Cst. Giesbrecht had played for raised funds to support the memorial. In addition to the plaque dedication two park benches were also dedicated to Cst. Giesbrecht's memory. The service was attended by approximately 300 people with messages being delivered by Mayor Ross Cairms of Vegreville, Insp. A.D.F. Burchill, O.C. Vegreville Sub-Division, S/Sgt. P.R. Wlodarczak, NCO i/c Vegreville Detachment, Mr. Ken Motiuk on behalf of the Honourable Don Mazankowski, Minister of Transport and A/Commr. D.A. Whyte, C.O. "K" Division. A/Commr. Whyte then unveiled the plaque. A thank you was then expressed on behalf of Cst. Giesbrecht's family by Frieda Hooke, a sister-in-law.

While in Vegreville A/Commr. Whyte also unveiled a plaque in the Vegreville Detachment Office. This plaque was placed by personnel serving at the time of the tragedy. The Town of Vegreville and its people have enjoyed a long and historical relationship with the Force. It is gratifying indeed to have the community show their sorrow for the tragedy in such a meaningful way.
