Preamble



HEREAS His Majefty by and with the advice and con-(e, fent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and the Commons of Great-Britain in Parliament affembled, by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of His Majesty's Reign, hath been gracioully pleased to constitute a Legislature

in this Province, in which the people thereof His Majesty's loyal Subjects do participate by their Reprefentatives in Affembly, and whereas by the aforesaid Act, power and authority is granted to the Governor Lieutenant Covernor or perfon administering the Government of this Province. to nominate and appoint proper perfons to execute the office of Return. ing Officer in the feveral Districts, Counties, Circles, Towns and Townships in this Province, for a certain time therein expressed, which power will expire on the twenty-fixth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety-three, and whereas it is expedient to make further Provision for the appointment of the faid Officers.
