An Act to amend the Post-Office Laws of this Province.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Post-Office Preamble. Laws, in the manner hereafter provided: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:
