Blenkarn's finances questioned

The Commissioner of Canada Elections is making inquiries into the election expenses return of Mississauga South MP Don Blenkarn as a result of correspondence from defeated Liberal candidate Paul Szabo.

Szabo wrote Commissioner J.O. Gorman in Ottawa July 22 because of "a number of which cannot be readily explained and which may warrant further investigation." He included a 25-page report which, indicated several areas where Blenkarn's expense statement should be reviewed.

Szabo, a chartered accountant, lost the Feb. 18 election to Blenkarn by 403 votes.

"Based on the items mentioned in this report, it could be estimated that Mr Blenkarn's election expenses possibly have been understated by at least \$7,000," Szabo's letter concluded.

Blenkarn's election expenses statement showed expenditures \$2,745 below the allowable limit of \$30,694

The major expense questioned by Szabo was election signs. He estimated Blenkarn's expense statement should have showed an additional \$2,900 for masonite signs. New

signs appeared during the last two weeks of the campaign, Szabo said.

Gerald Duggan, official agent for Blenkarn, says no new masonite signs were purchased for the campaign. He says Szabo's contention that the commercial value of signs reused from previous elections was underestimated is, "the only thing in all of his complaints that he could have an argument

Duggan says it is difficult to assess the value of a used sign

'I'm surprised that he'd (Szabo) sink to

such depths," Duggan says

The law offices of Blenkarn, Roche, Kerr
on Lakeshore Road and of Blenkarn's constituency office in Port Credit were not used for election purposes as Szabo indicated. Duggan says

Two constituency office workers, Ann Meredith and Joan Williamson, who worked in the campaign were laid off from their jobs. The constituency office was closed during the campaign

Blenkarn says some of the allegations are humorous. Szabo questioned why the cost of office furniture for Blenkarn's campaign office at Cliffway Plaza wasn't included in his statement. The truth of the matter is that

most of it's junk you couldn't give away say Blenkarn.

Szabo's report suggested Blenkarn had underestimated the cost of office supplies. photographs, his headquarters' sign, headquarters' decorations, furnishings, rent, and the cost of food for scrutineers.

Duggan says food for workers was not paid for and says it is not considered an election expense in any event. Other costs listed were true charges, he says

The request for information on the expenses was made by him personally. Szabo said, although he discussed it with the Mississauga South Liberal executive before submitting it

I hope Mr Blenkarn and Mr Duggansa realize this is not an attack," said Szabo

Szabo said he did not intend his questions of clarification to be made public. The Mississauga Times did not obtain the correspondence from Szabo

Commissioner Gorman says the report is being treated as one of the few complaints his department receives. The matter is being investigated by his office. The RCMP could be called on to do investigation as well. A report is expected by mid-September at the




