

Penalty shot clinches B's win

A dramatic goal by Bill Campbell on a penalty shot with 26 seconds remaining assured the Mississauga Junior B PCO's of a victorious 11-9 home opener against defending champion Whitby Sunday.

The penalty shot was awarded when Whitby goalie Dave Crosby threw his stick at Campbell, who apparently had a sure goal. At the time, PCO's held a slim 10-0 advantage.

Campbell's casual and

calm march toward the goal seemed an eternity. Suddenly, he faked a shot to the upper left hand corner and bounced the ball through the goaltenders legs.

The PCO bench erupted in jubilation as player rushed to congratulate Campbell, whose last minute theatrics capped off an impressive three-goal night.

After the penalty shot, Mississauga's unshakable defense prevented the visitors from staging any last second upset. PCO's

defense was admirable throughout the entire game, except for a few lapses in the second period that cost them the lead.

The defense created numerous offensive opportunities for the hosts. In addition to Campbell's trio, Kevin Rushton, Scott Aird, and Kim Crossman fired two goals apiece, while single efforts were contributed by Glen MacDonald and Steve Hunt.

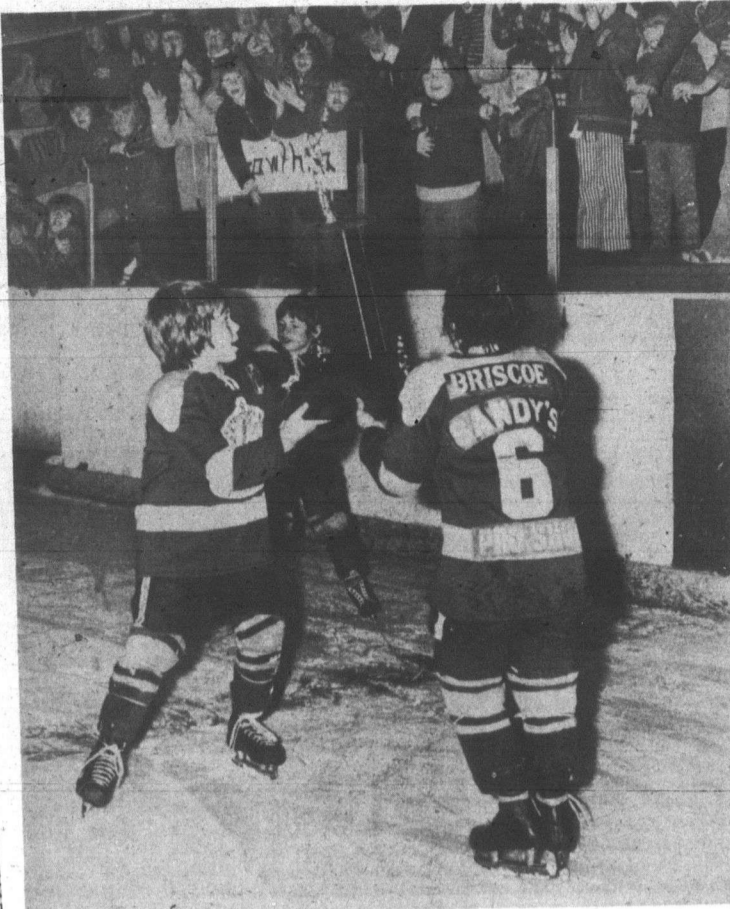

Cinderella Cawthra kids consolation champions

Cawthra Sandys, a lightweight unit of pint-sized hockey warriors in regular league combat this past season, became all-conquering heroes of the ninth staging of the annual Mississauga paperweight hockey tournament.

Having finished in fifth place among eight contestants in the paperweight major series of the Mississauga Hockey League, the Cawthra crew went into the tourney (one of Canada's largest get-togethers at that age level) strictly as a Cinderella entry.

But when it was all over, coach Clare Martin's paperweights became the first local team since the first competition in 1965 to emerge with the consolation series crown. They did it the hard way, knocking off Rexdale's St. Benedicts 5-4 in overtime. Mike Culos, a consistent point-getter throughout the nine-playing-day tournament, got the winning marker, snatching his second big goal of the consolation showdown. Wade Briscoe was another two-goal hero while Ken Schwartz added a singleton.
