medial Legislation. The "Globe" is denouncing in most violent terms any interference with Manitoba as "coercion". Laurier has taken refuge behind a proposition for a Commission, which seems to take hold of the minds of some, although it is ridicuously absurd, and is only intended to cause delay. Should change sides as rapidly as it did on the Riel question. It is unnecessary, however, for me to elaborate upon this question, as you fully understand our position.

The success which has attended your interviews with Chamberlain upon the Steamship and Cable questions will, I think, have its effect upon the electorate in showing that we are progressive and hopeful for the future, that we are pushing to a successful issue matters of great import to the Dominion and to the Empire.
