MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRIME MINISTER:

re expenses, trips to Washington and Georgia

The points requiring your decision, or approval,
are:

1. Do you wish to include Miss Zavitske's account as a part of your own? In the case of your expenses, only the total amount appears in the Auditor General's report. It is not necessary to give details. In the case, however, of the other accounts it is necessary to give full details. Unless you include Miss Zavitske's expenses in your own, it will be necessary to have her name and full details appear in the Auditor General's report. *OK*

Your expenses were \$798.60; Miss Zavitske's \$280.91.
If you include her's, your total would then be \$1079.51.

2. Cash advanced to you, by myself, amounted to \$340.00. This amount is included in the total above referred to - \$798.60.

3. *You told me* Do you wish to be able to say that only your expenses between Ottawa and Washington and return, were paid by the Government, and that your expenses between Washington and Georgia,
