I beg to inform you that Mr. H. Medel, Indian Agent at Balcarree, has reported a shortage of \$0.00 in the annaty money forwarded to him by you. He etates that the paskage was received from the Post Office with the scale intact and the contents were carefully counted by himself as well as by the Agency Clork, Mr. Penny, and both found a shortage of \$0.00 in a bundle of old one dollar bills. These officers report that they re-checked if three times to make sure, but with the same result. He total surpressived, viz., \$8000.00 instead of \$8000.00, was all yaid out to Indians and recorded in a Pay-list; the assent yold each family being entered separately and the total corresponds with the assent the Agent received, which is additional power that the chertage really existed. The constants therefore is that unknown to your effects a paskage containing only 64 instead of 200 bills of one dollar decommentation were forwarded.

For your information the alips received by the Agent with the package are invertel sent you.
