- He then collapsed, we took him to the jeep and from there to the guardhouse.
- At the guar house did he wake up again? I wasn't in the guardhouse, I had to change clothing since I was on duty in town. A.
- I will show you a drawing or sketch of an area and I want to know, I want you to state to the Court if you recognize, if
- you ever see: that area? (Shows sketo: to witness) I could remember better on the ground itself, if I could see the interior of the house and so on.

JA: Does that area look familiar to you or not, yes or no?

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Prosecutor continues

Does this area look familiar to you?
As far as the canal, the sidewalk, the road and railroad goes, yes, but to the location of the houses no.

JAI Ask him directly if he is able to point out the location of the house?

Prosecutor continues

- You say you are familiar with the road, canal, railroad track and all that; are you familiar or are you able to point out one of those houses as the one you have been there?
- Do you know the number of the house where you entered that day? I went back there afterwards and identified the house having A. the number "88" as being the house where the arrest was made.
- Do you know the name of the street?

I could not say.

CROSS-EXAMINED BY THE DEFENDING OFFICER

When you first saw the vehicle that you said was backed up to the canal were it's wheels overhanging to such an extent it could not be driven away? I don't know much about the mechanics, the disposition of the wheels on a 60 cwt but I know that it would have been im-possible to leave on his rear wheels.

- The wheels were not touching the pavement.
- When you first saw Brisson that day you said an officer was with 4
- him, who was the officer? I don't remember the name of the officer, I was only arrived to the Regiment.
- That Regiment did he belong to? Formerly I was with the Meisponneguve. MAPS.
 - What Regiment did the officer belong? I couldn't say,
