A detailed official account of Canada's wartime policies, covering questions of command, organization recruitment, supply and production. Indispensable for an examination of Canada's role in the Second World War.

Granatstein, J.L.

Canada's War: The Politics of the Mackenzie King Government, 1939-1945,
Toronto, Oxford University Press, 1975

The development of nationalism through Canada's effort in the Second World War. Attention is mostly domestic but there are chapters on foreign and military policies.

Stacey, C.P.

Mackenzie King and the Atlantic Triangle, Toronto, Macmillan, 1976

A short but lively discussion of Mackenzie King's attitudes towards Great Britain and the United States before and during the Second World War.

Hill, O. Mary.

Canada's Salesman to the World: the Department of Trade and Commerce, 1892-1939, Montreal, McGill-Queen's University Press, 1977

A sponsored history of the Department, drawing heavily on its records.
