VII. And be it further enacted, That the Commanding Officer of each Banalions may appoint Battalion shall have power to appoint from time to time; suitable perfons as Drummers, Buglers, and Fifers to his Battalion, and to difplace them and to appoint others in their flead; and that the Commanding Officer of a Company thall have power, with the confent of of Battalion, may appoint the Commanding Officer of the Battalion to which he may belong, under his command; and if any person so to be appointed shall refule to accept the office to which he shall be appointed, or having accepted, shall refuse or neglect to perform his duty, he shall for every offence forfeit and pay the fum of twenty shillings; but there shall not be appointed more than three Serjeants and three Corporals to any one Company, except Flank Companies, which may have four Serjeants each.

VIII. And be it further enacled, That all fines imposed by the foregoing fections of this Act, shall be recoverable before the Captain or Officer commanding the Company to which the delinquent may belong, and be levied by diffress and fale of the delinquent's goods by an order of the faid Commanding Officer, directed to a Non-commiffioned Officer of the fame Company, who ishereby empowered to ferve and execute the fame (with the like fees as Confiables may receive) rendering the overplus if any, after deducting the costs and charges of fuch diffress and fale to the delinquent; and if no goods or effects shall be found whereon to levy the faid fine, such delinquent shall, by warrant under the hand and feal of fuch Commanding Officer, be committed to the County Gaol, there to remain for the term of two days for the fine for each day's delinquency; and the keeper of any Gaol is hereby authorifed to receive and keep fuch delinquent during the time specified in such warrant, and then to discharge him on payment of the cultomary Gaol fees, together with fuch fees as the Non-commissioned Officer may be entitled to receive as herein before Delinquent may appeal mentioned: Provided always, that any fuch delinquent may appeal from the sentence of the Commanding Officer of the Company to which he manding Officer of the may belong, to the Commanding Officer of the Battalion, who is hereby authorifed and empowered to remit the fine imposed upon such delinquent either in part or the whole, as the circumstances of the cafe may require.
