The Judges of the Superior Courts of Common Law, or The Judges to a majority of them, may, by rules made in term time, settle makerules, &c. the forms of the writs of summons, Certiorari, Mandamus and Execution, and may regulate the practice respecting the suing out, service and execution of such writs, and the punishment for disobeying the same or any other writ or order of the Court or Judge, and respecting the practice generally, in hearing and determining the validity of such elections or appointments, and respecting the costs thereon; and may from time to time rescind, alter or add to such rules; but all existing rules shall remain in force until rescinded or altered as aforesaid;

132. The appointment of members of Municipal Councils, Appointments when required to be made under this Act shall be deemed equivalent to elections within the preceding section, and in such cases the relator may be any member of the Council or any elector of the Municipality or Ward for which the appointment was made.

FIRST MEETING OF MEMBERS ELECT.

133. The members of every Municipal Council, (except First meetings County Councils,) and the trustees of every Police Village, of Councils. shall hold their first meeting at noon, on the third Monday of the same January in which they are elected, or on some day thereafter at noon; and the members of every County Council
