- 1°. Since the prorogation, communications have been received from the colonial office and the governor general, on the subject of a federal union of the North American provinces, which will be placed before you at an early day.
- I am happy to inform you that your address to her majesty on the intercolonial railway was very graciously received. The correspondence with the Imperial government, Canada, and New Brunswick, which induced me to send a delegation to England, will be submitted, with the report of the delegates, for your information.
