Shanghai, Dec. 9.—The rioters captured after the abortive attack on the training ship Choko and the French steamer K. G. Groulx on trial yesterday morning. Eye-witnesses, which include marines and officers of the training ship as well as the crew of the K. G. Groulx, are now testifying before the court specially convened.

Paris, Dec. 10.—General H. J. E. Gouraud, who lost an arm as the result of wounds suffered while commanding the French expeditionary force in the Dardanelles and who sustained other severe wounds, has been assigned to command the French army in the front, although he has barely recovered. The general himself applied for active employment again.

London, Dec. 10.—The Norwegian steamer Ingstad has been sunk. Except for one man who was drowned, all the members of the crew were saved. Ingstad was a vessel of 780 tons gross, and was built in 1910.

London, Dec. 10.—The Danish steamer Minsk has been sunk. The crew was saved. The vessel was a steamer with a gross tonnage of 1,229. She was owned in Copenhagen. The vessel sailed from Blyth, England, on Nov. 13, but shipping records do not give her destination.

London, Dec. 10.—The largest labor organization in the history of England, representing about 2,000,000 men, was formed to-day for the purpose of offensive or defensive action in matters representing wages and conditions of work.
