INDEFATIGABLE LAUNCHED.

London, Oct. 28.—The Indefatiga-
ble, Great Britain's largest armored
cruiser, was launched at the Devon-
port yards to-day. She is an im-
proved version of the Inflexible type. She
is of 19,000 tons burden, with 45,000
horse-power, and an estimated speed of
27 knots an hour. The new fighter
is 570 feet long and has a beam of 80
feet. She will carry eight 12-inch and
twenty 4-inch guns.

Synopsis of Canadian North- west Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a fam-
ily, or any male over 18 years old, may
homestead a quarter-section of available
Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or
Alberta. The applicant must appear in per-
son at the Dominion Lands Agency or As-
sessment of the district. Entry by proxy may
be made at any agency on certain conditions,
by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or
sister of intending homesteader.

Duties—Six months' residence upon and
cultivation of the land in each of three years.
A homesteader may live within nine miles of
his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres,
solely owned and occupied by him or by his
father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sis-
ter.

In certain conditions a homesteader in good
standing may pre-empt a quarter-section
acreside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per
acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each
of six years from date of homestead entry
(including the time required to earn a pre-emption
patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted the home-
stead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption
patent may take a purchased homestead in certain
districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must
reside six months in each of three years,
cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth
\$500.00.

HE WILL APPEAL.

Russell So Decides if Decision of Com-
missioner is Against Him.

Cleveland, Ohio, Oct. 28.—Attorneys
believe that the case of William L. Rus-
sell, the mining promoter whom the Cana-
dian authorities are attempting to ex-
tradite on the charge of fraud in connection
with the flotation of mining issues,
will not end with the decision of United
States Commissioner Fred Walther. Mr.
Walther will deliver his ruling in a few
days, but the case will then be appealed
to Federal Judge Taylor, it is thought,
thus delaying considerably the termina-
tion of the matter.

It is pointed out that if Mr. Walther
refuses to allow Russell to be extradited,
the Dominion, sparing no expense,
will go higher, and that, on the other
hand, if Russell is ordered back, at-
torneys of the standing of those de-
fending him will not let him go un-
til the last resource has been ex-
hausted.

CHARGED WITH THEFT.
Five Cars of Crushed Stone the Al-
leged Booty.

Niagara Falls, Oct. 28.—Interesting
developments are expected at the
trial of John O'Neil, charged with
stealing five cars of crushed stone
from the Michigan Central Railway,
before Magistrate Rathbone at Bridge-
burg on Saturday morning. O'Neil is
yardmaster for the company at
Bridgeburg, and it is alleged he un-
lawfully sold the five cars of stone to
Mr. Lobbs, of the firm of Upton &
Lobbs, St. Catharines, for \$72. The
value of the stone is about three times
this sum. The firm is constructing
the Niagara-Fort Erie boulevard, and
it is stated the stone was consigned
by O'Neil to stations adjacent to the
boulevard and used for its construc-
tion. O'Neil has been released on \$2-
000 bail, and will be defended by Mr. V.
M. German, K. C.
