There was money enough in the family to make some provision for the care of the children, but it was almost impossible to secure any-one who would render this service, so afraid are many people of this dread disease. A visitor to the home says that time and time again she had found the baby sleeping in her sick mother's bed, and near by food was stored from which the children par-tock. A sequel is revealed in the fact that to-day one of these five children is a patient in Gravenhurst, and the baby is in the children's ward as the Toronto Free Hospital for Consumptives. It is for the care of such sufferens as these that the Muskoka Free Hospital for Con-sumptives has been built. The tax on the accommodation is heavy, and the Trustees have only been able to make the large ex-tensions of the present year by borrowing heavily from the bank. 
