ONLY COMPLAINT IN COUNTRY IS NEED OF MORE RAIN

Farmers Enthusiastic About the Crop Prospects and All Theirs Point to an Early Harvest and By Far the Most Abundant.

DROUGHT BEGINNING TO BE FELT A LITTLE

Reports Are of the Best That Could Be Expected at Present Time and the One Grievance is That More Rain Would Help Growing.

Beneficial showers have been of good effect in the country during the last week, but there are some points which report need of rain. In some places the rain has been too gentle to be of any great effect, and more constant showers are wanted just at this juncture. The sunshine has been all that is needed, and with a little more drought the weather would be ideal growing weather.

Still, the complaints come only from a few points, and at the majority of places in southern Alberta all things look well for the prospect of a great bumper crop. The acreage, which is much larger than last year, will yield even more heavily, and unless some untoward circumstance arises to make a difference, there will be one of the most abundant harvests on the average which has been experienced in the west.

The growth during the past fortnight at many places has been quite phenomenal, and though on an average the seed was quite two weeks later in going into the ground than last year, the crop is now just as far advanced as it was at this time a year ago. That there will be an early harvest is the next thing expected, and some farmers are even now predicting the cutting of the grain at a time two weeks earlier than last year.

Still, during the next few weeks, rain will be devoutly hoped for, and farmers will not grumble when the clouds hover overhead and the rain comes down even heavily. The only danger will be that of hail, and already a report has come in of considerable damage which has been done in the neighborhood of Alder. The other evening a storm of hail, if the rain proves as it has done in the last few days, and only a little more constant, the crop will prosper wonderfully.

Twenty Per Cent. Increase.

Taken all over, according to official reports, there is from 19 to 20 per cent more acreage in grain this year than last. The increase in the south is greater than that. The notable feature in the district immediately south of Calgary is the increase in the barley crop, a great amount being grown there for brewing purposes. There is practically no falling off anywhere, and the crop is as enthusiastic for the crop of 1913 as could be.

SAVANTION FEATURE TO EQUAL DRILLS AT ENCAMPMENT

Col. Cruikshanks, in Orders for Annual Gathering of Military District No. 13, Issues Strict Instructions Regarding Care of Militiamen's Health.

GEN. HAMILTON AND CAPT. STOVER U. S. A. GUESTS

List of Staff Officers Made Public By Commandant Routine of Day Announced and Appointments Made For Service on Various Boards.

STANDING orders to govern the annual encampment of the Military District, No. 13, to be held in Calgary this month, have been issued by Col. A. E. Cruikshanks, commanding the district. The affair this year is broader in scope than ever before. Studies in sanitation will take rank with the usual studies in tactics, and special orders regarding cleanliness, issued by the colonel, are stricter and more definite than in previous years.

Fifty full-time per day will be devoted to drill and training. Every detail of camp life has been provided for in the complete orders issued by Col. Cruikshanks, and the men will be treated just as if they were in the field.

Camp Officers Named.

A complete list of camp officers has been named in advance by Colonel Cruikshanks, formerly of the United States army, and now a resident of Edmonton, will also be a guest in uniform at the drills.

1. Rations—President, Major E. G. Benwell, 21st A.H.; members, Capt. Alder, 19th A.D.; Lieut. Duckler, 19th A.H.

3. Accidental damage to arms—President, Major R. L. Bury, 15th H.; members, Capt. Westmore, 23rd A.R.; Lieut. J. C. Dyer, 21st A.H.

4. Disability to officers, N.C.O.'s and privates—President, Major W. A. Griesbach, 19th A.D.; members, Lieut. R. E. A. Lloyd, 15th; Lieut. Page, 35th C.A.H.

5. Disability to horses—President, the P.V.O.; members, Capt. D. R. Sandeman, 23rd C.A.H.; Lieut. Buchanan, 23rd A.R.

Most Clean up Camp.

A penalty of having the site of any unit's camp unclean when the encampment ends has been provided by the colonel. Officers and privates are urged that every unit commander must, upon breaking camp, fill his trenches and pits, and burn all company refuse, leaving the ground clean and level. The privy and latrine will be cleaned by civilian labor and the expenses charged up to the unit at fault. Companies upon arrival at camp are required to erect temporary incinerators,

at which horse litter and waste paper will be burned.

Orders, which refer to hygiene, reads as follows:

"The necessity for strict cleanliness in everything connected with the preparation and handling of food cannot be too strongly insisted upon, and all details of the system adopted in the camp kitchens and messes under their charge are satisfactory from a hygienic point of view.

"Particular attention should be paid to the clothing worn by cooks and waiters, and to the condition of the dishes. Special arrangements should be made for an ample supply of clean cloths, and the practice of using unsuitable articles for such purposes should be strictly prohibited.

"The horse lines should be covered every fourth day with a thin layer of dry straw or hay which will be sprinkled with crude petroleum and burnt off, to destroy the larvae of flies.

"Any stagnant water in the vicinity of the camp will have to be removed to prevent the breeding of flies and mosquitoes.

"Camping grounds—Troops should as far as possible avoid moving over the ground of other units.

"Horses should not be hitched to stand pipes or be allowed to become entangled with their water troughs.

"An officer from each unit and a N.C.O. from each squadron will be detailed to superintend the watering of horses.

"Commanding officers are held responsible that careful supervision be exercised to prevent waste of water. The stand pipes with their cocks and drinking cups are to be allotted to units, who will be held responsible for their safe custody.

"Commanding officers of units will be held responsible that water troughs are thoroughly cleaned out at least once a week, and when the unit leaves the camp the troughs should be washed with soap in water troughs is strictly forbidden."

SHOP ASSISTANTS ORGANIZE TOMORROW

There will be a mass meeting of shop clerks and assistants of Calgary in the hall tomorrow evening for the purpose of organizing an association of shop assistants in the city of Calgary. The association will be founded with a view to securing better conditions for those who are engaged in the city, both male and female. It will be the intention to assist the retail merchants in their move towards the passing of the early closing law, which will insist on the closing of shops and stores before 6 o'clock, and also to provide for a weekly half holiday when stores will be closed. Each place has clear streets here and the retail merchants will not come under this category. The meeting will be held at the hall of the legal legislature, T. H. Hillecks. There will be either shop clerks or assistants of the clerks themselves.
