German Agreement.

London, Oct. 24 .- A dispatch from for several years. Rome says: King Victor Emanuel has received from Emperor Kwang Su, through the Chinese minister to Great Britain, a message, begging him to facilitate the conclusion of peace. It is similar to the messages sent to the other powers.

THE ANGLO-GERMAN PACT. A high official of the German foreign office asserted this evening that Aus-tria-Hungary and Italy have expressed their formal adherence to the Anglo-German agreement, but that France, Russia and the United States have not defined their positions. FRENCH VIEWS.
