THE GRAND DUKE VLADIMIR DEAD

Oldest Uncle of Russian Czar
Dead at St. Petersburg.

St. Petersburg, Feb. 17. — Grand Duke Vladimir Alexandrovich, oldest uncle of the Russian Czar, died at his residence in St. Petersburg, Feb. 17, at the age of 57. He had been suffering from a long illness.

The grand duke was the second son of the late Emperor Alexander II and brother of the present Czar's father, Alexander III. As the oldest uncle of Emperor Nicholas, Vladimir

had a large share in the direction of the ruler's government. He was 6 years old and was one of the Czar's closest advisers.

APPLICATION REFUSED.

Ottawa, Feb. 17.—The railway commission had decided not to grant an application made some time ago

behalf of the Wallaceburg Sugar Company. The application was for averaging of demurrage on freight cars. The time allowed for the unloading of a car without payment of demurrage is forty-eight hours after arrival. The application asked that where a car was unloaded in less than forty-eight hours the time margin should be recorded to the credit of the firm, as an offset against excessive time taken in unloading other cars. The board refused the application on the grounds that it would work an inequity on the other firms.
