LONDON'S LACROSSE TEAM LOSES FIRST GAME

TRIBE LET BRANTS DOWN GENTLY IN THIRD STRAIGHT

5-4 Win Comes After Brants Had Broken Tie.

UMP'S LEG INJURED

Hit in Seventh by One of Wheeler's Shoots—Malmquest Heavy Hitter.

The Tees and Brants hooked up in the last game of their series yesterday afternoon, and the locals made it three in a row, by virtue of a 5-4 win. It gives Wetzel a firm grip on first place.
