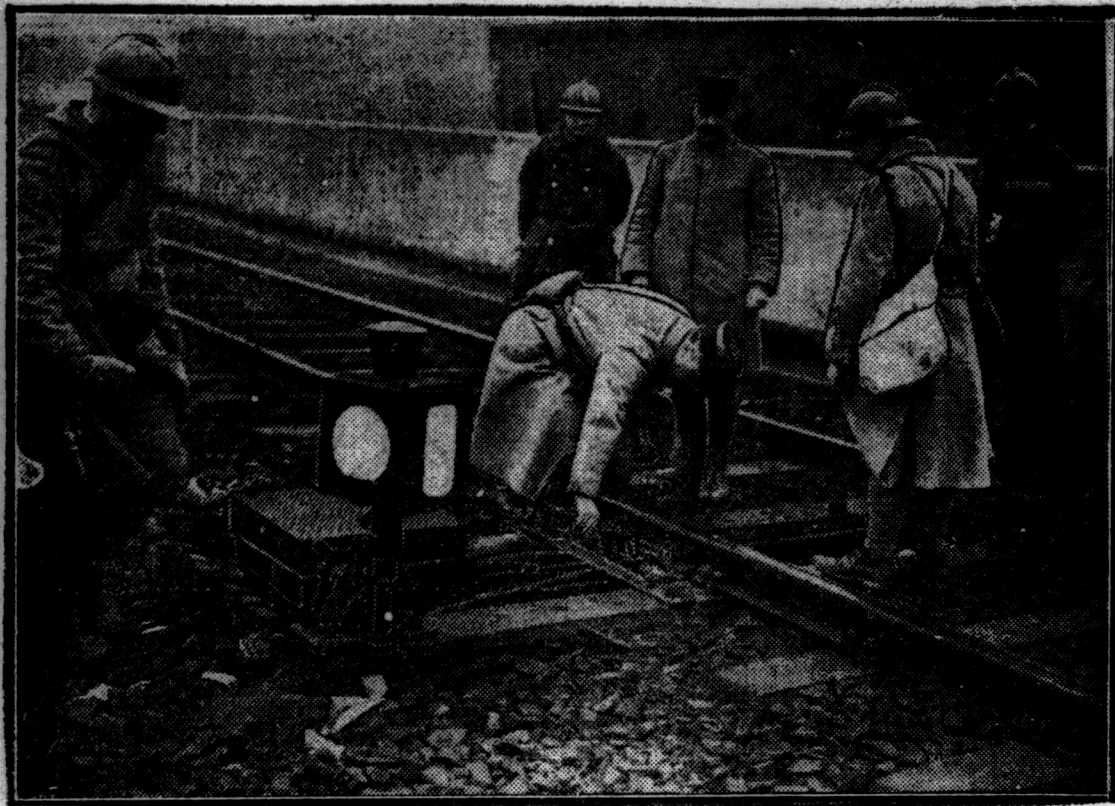

Mrs. Rabbit appropriately announcing the fact that Easter is upon us.



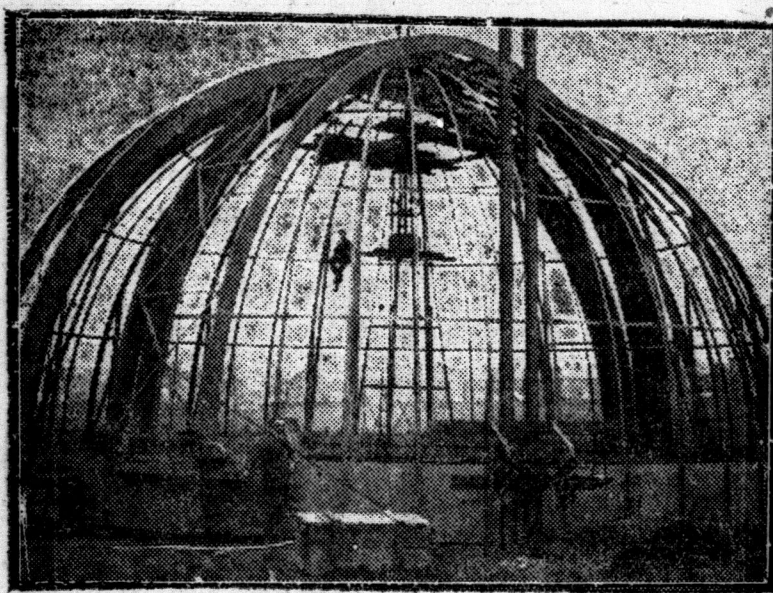

Three hurdlers taking a jump in line in the recent sports at Oxford University, England.



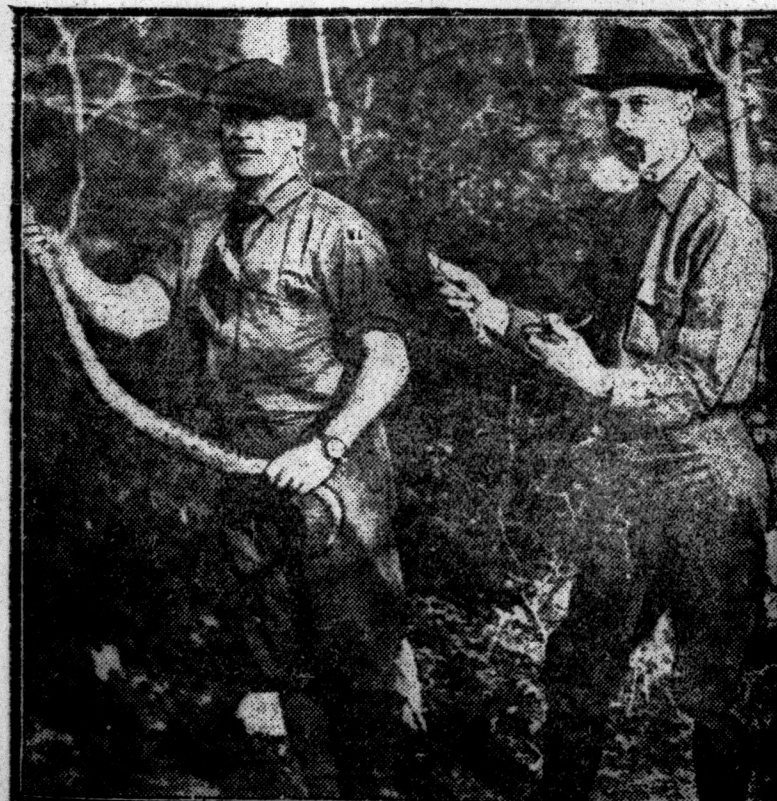
