The most noticeable feature of the first draft of the Stationing Committee of the Toronto Conference is the disregard of calls which have been tendered to and accepted by several of the city clergymen. The meinbers of this committee have evidently deemed it expedient and necessary that several of these calls should be set aside.

Emory, who last year received and accepted a call to St. Paul's, but was supplanted by Rev. Dr. Parker, was this year invited to the pustorate of Elm-street Church, made vacant by the death of Rev. W. J. Maxwell. His acceptance of the call has again been ignored, Rev. Dr. Galbraith being appointed to Elm-street, and Mr. Emery remaining in Davisvill, where he has been laboring for the past year.
