The Advantages of College Residence.

The following speech was delivered at the commencement exercises on Tues10 23, at 81. Michael's College, go J. Savage, '96:

Grace, Reveren Fathers, 'an Gerthems.- Our exercises 'rendy assumed considerable and expect you are fatigued anxious to hear the strains of unal Anthem than anything I may shout the advantages of College readless. In this ago and country, especially in the city of Toronto, all questions relating to the mental and noral development of the children and youth have received the most careful and universal attention of the people. Ministers of religion speak upon them from their pulpits; editors almost daily devote long and learned articles to them; business men discuss them in their offices and at their clubs; and even the children on our streets may be heard arguing over education! matters. Such a general and live, y discussion of these questions, though the views advanced are often erroneous, and sometimes pernicious, is bound to be advantageous to the cause of education. Now, if all were agreed as to what the word "Education" means I might pass it over and proceed to the discussion of the manifold advantages of a College that requires residence of its students over one that dispenses with this regulation; but since the opinions on this subject are so varied and opposite it will be well for us first to agree upon a definition for thus word. The next and final reason I advance as a pien for requiring residence is that associating with other students is a surread development. Why so? you may ask. First, because a student residing in college is to a great extent removed from the temptations of the world; his mind is not dissipated by the thought-less friviolities of the society news column, the noise and clatter of the busy world is shut from his cars and he dwells in a quiet and soothing intellectual amorphere.

Again, a student in a college residence lives with men, not merely with books. Doubtless you have all heard that the greatest misfortune that can befall a man is to be reared an only child; such a boy grows up wiltu, petulent and impatient of restraint. So also the greatest misfortune that can befall a student is that he should live alone among his books. Such a student may know all that is to be known in the world without being able to do any one of them. He becomes narrow-minded, irritable, intelorant, self-sufficient. In the silence c'. his study errors and mistakes steal upon him and enter his warped and distorted mind as infallibut truths. The lesson he needed most he has failed to learn, namely: how to live with men. On the other hand the student in residence is open-hearted, cheerful and magnaminous, ready to respect the opinions and rights of others, and to acknowledge that others and teaching the his neighbory. in the person of their students and to give to the world men whose hearts beat with the love of country and of God.

And then there is the discipline.
