## ontario

That ithe close of navigalion on the upper lakes is drawing to a close is envdenced by the rusb of lumber shipments. Several vessels have, inaded dunng the past week at Georyian Bay ports for Siginaw, Bay City, Buffalo, Tonswanda, rud other distributing points : When the season's shipments are ovet, the stock monteriog at the mills will not be unusual, is large, in fact, some grades of pine are in Ingtt supply. Most of the mills in the northern districis bave closed opera tions for the season, but a tew are still runniag. By means of an caexceptional fresbet logs that were supposedly hung up ontil next spring have now reached the mills.
Our Ottawa correspondent is authority for the statement that one ai least of the Ottawa Valley manufacturers has sold bis 1901 cut of British deals, while we understand that negothations are under wayloak1ag to ouber purchases. The market is lifely to remain quiet ontil after the turn of the year, wheo more activity and bigher prices in some grades are looked for.
Hardwood dealers repon no rush of orders, but a satisfactory number of naquires. Soft elm lumber, is weik oning in reported cottury of ppees by one ot iwo dealers. Hemlock is in a strong position, as the production of hemlock logs dunng the present winter promises to be unguatly inght.

The reason of navigation from the St. Lawrace is now closed, the last vessels having sailed a ftw days aga. As will be seen by the figures pablished to anotber colump, the total phipinents of lombet from St. L-awrence ports to Europe was

Buiding lumber in the Eastern States is in greater demand, while the movement of stock to manufactarers has lessened This later condition is no doubs dute to the desire to reduce stock to make in venidries extier and to, show a better cash balance The number of enquires in the marke show that kenerally light stocks are beld by retall dealers and con: sumers. There is a most hopeful feellag in regard in the prospertive consump. tion of, boulding lumber, as it is predicted on all sides that the building sezson of topl will be unusually brisk. Saginaw. dealers report the movement of $15,00,000$ feet of pine lamber siace the election, and although quotations have not chang ed, the market is conceded to be syronger. Los run lamber of good quality is worth \$18, hox lumber from $\mathbf{S i n}_{12}$ to $\mathbf{S}_{16}$, will culls from Sit to 513 , and Norway Si6. At Buffalo, some fear of a shortage un the catting-up grades of prne is reported, while at Philadelpha the middle grades are weak, and the lower prades, espectaj. ly 6 inch strips and 12 inch boards, fairly active. GREAT BRITARE
The British timber market is in a confused state, whth conflicting views heard on allstdes. The decreased consumption is one of the most unfavorable factors, as until the demand from the consumers shalt H ecorne more active little improvement in the position of the market can be expected. Selling for next year has pot yet commenced, although in the face of the prediction that prices for next pear's shipments will be lower than those ruling last spring, we bear that some sales of Swedish gagds have been marie on a bass ten shillings bigher than one year ago. The specifications, it is sald, bave been exceptional but nevertheless, these sales casnos bat have a strengthening effeet upon the market. That the parket bas declised shapply dungy the past two months canoet bo dispoted. In bat tens the declinie bas areraged about 25
shilliogs per standard, while zorth of Europe deals have teen marked down from one to two pounds. Canadian deals have mostly been in strong hands, and consequeztly bave not declinet so sharply. At a recent auction sale $3 \times 9$ Quebec spyuce of second qual iy sold at 49 :os per standard.
