THE MUNRO BURSARIES.
The Winter Session of Daihousic College will commence on Wednesday, 27th October. 1880. The Matriculation Examination will begin on that day, at 10 o'clock, a. m., and Classes will be opened on Monday, lat November. Students may enter as (1) Undergraduotes, with the intention of applying for a University Degree in Arts or Science at the end of their course, or (2) as General Students who do not look forward to a Degree. For the latter no Matriculation Examination is

required.
