NOTICE.

Squatters Upon School Lands in Manitoba.

NOTICE is hereby given that under the Act of the Parliament of Canada, 56 Victoria chapter 18, passed in the year 1893, it is provided that certain persons, then in school who were in full occupation of School Lands prior to the 1st January, 1890, and who have since that date continued to occupy and cultivate such lands in accordance with the requirements of the homestead provisions of the Dominion Lands Act, shall be permitted to make homestead entries thereon.

It is alleged, however, that the persons thus entitled do not comprise all who by virtue of the occupation which that Act recognizes are entitled to the same confirmation, and this notice is therefore given calling upon all persons who were residing upon School Lands within the Province of Manitoba prior to the 1st of January, 1890, and have since that date continued to occupy and cultivate such lands in accordance with the requirements of the homestead provisions of the Dominion Lands Act, to apply to the persons thus entitled.
