

- \$4.5 million in support for two CUSO projects in the fields of community development and rural producer cooperatives;
- Phase II of a World University of Canada project to field 100 teachers to secondary schools and teacher-training centres. Under Phase I (\$6.7 million) 100 teachers for rural secondary schools and primary teaching centres and 50 technical school teachers were provided and 50 Zimbabweans were trained in Canada as technical instructors.
- a \$900,000 project carried out by the Manitoba Institute of Management to support small business entrepreneurs through training, improved management and financial assistance;
- a linkage between Dalhousie University and the University of Zimbabwe in which Dalhousie has assisted in the design and implementation of a Diploma and Master's degree in Public Administration, provided teacher training, professional development, produced materials for training and research, and developed library resources and teaching materials.
- an \$8.9 million project implemented by the Ontario International Corporation to provide assistance in technical education, trades testing, and curriculum development.

PRIVATE SECTOR LINE OF CREDIT

A \$14.7 million line of credit is easing the critical shortage of foreign exchange which is hampering Zimbabwe's economic recovery. The funds are being used to purchase the Canadian commodities, goods and equipment needed to revive the business sector. Eighty orders amounting to \$3.5 million were placed during the year, covering a full range of industrial products, including synthetics, aircraft spares and parts.
