

- There will be full Canadian command and control over Canadian test and evaluation facilities used by the US.
- The use of Canadian civil airspace will be approved and controlled by the Canadian Minister of Transport.
- All Canadian environmental and safety laws, regulations and orders applicable to the Canadian Forces will apply to US Forces conducting the tests. The US will pay for any environmental studies required by Canada.
- The United States will be liable for damage caused to Crown lands or private property under the terms of the NATO Status of Forces Agreement.
- The program will be funded by the United States, unless Canada specifically chooses to contribute to a particular project.
- Canada will have access to data relevant to Department of National Defence programs gathered during tests done in Canada.
- Either side will have the right to cancel, suspend, postpone or terminate any specific test.
- The agreement will remain in force for five years and will be renewed for a further five years, subject to provisions outlined in the Agreement. It may be terminated on twelve months' notice in writing, or without advance notice under specific listed circumstances.
