and often this is where their powers end. It is therefore not up to them to allow reproduction of this material. Concerning the American solution mentioned earlier by the Hon. Member, I can assure him that the Canadian solution found in the White Paper is at least just as good.

It is said in the White Paper that, from now on, non-profit teaching institutions will be entitled to a special and limited exemption in the case of public representations for educational purposes, that educational broadcasters will be entitled to a limited exemption with requirements similar to those provided for educational purposes to facilitate the production of educa-

tional programs for internal use, that new collective copyright negotiation companies may be set up to protect certain rights for which individual negotiation is impractical, such as in the area of photocopying, which is especially important in the field of education.
