1. Adult systematic collection (pinned specimens) for courses in classification. 2. Economic collection of all stages in vials. 3. Economic slide collection for small orders. 4. Permanent collection (pinned specimens). 5. Permanent slide collection (small orders). 6. Taxonomic collection (slides for course in taxonomy). 7. Larval collection (in vials). 8. Economic collection (in vials) for elementary courses. 9. Parasitological collection. 10. Histological collection. 11. Morphological collection. Owing to understaffing and absence of suitable containers and equipment, the foregoing collections had either not been started, or were in an advanced state of depletion five years ago. While by no means adequate at present, they have been growing rapidly during the past few years. 5. SUPPLIES-Three points require mention in connection with this item: (a) The amount expended under this item is governed entirely by the number of students taking the courses, each of which requires a certain fixed minimum which is uncontrollable. In fact we have usually had to borrow from our "Equipment" vote to get through the session. (b) The cost of zoological material, increased by the necessity of paying American exchange, probably exceeds that of
